THE GRADING CORNER - PAN eGRADE What grade is it? Thank you to those who gave it a try. The consensus was MS 63. It is in a GSA holder. <u>http://www.coinresource.com/articles/gsa.html</u> A few had it at MS 62 and that is understandable with the amount of bag marks on liberty's cheek. That is typical of the GSA Carson City Dollars. For those that are new to this, the face area receives

the most scrutiny. The field or flat part has marks below E. The next criticism would be the scuffs on the high point of the cap. The reverse fares better having less marks. The obvious is in the field between the wing and the wreath. There is a small gouge on the eagle's talon. Of note is the die crack through STATES OF AM.

Would you like to try another one? This is an ungraded or raw copper half cent. Copper collectors are pickey so this should be interesting. Grading without the coin in hand is a disadvantage because the viewer is not able to rotate the coin and not able to spot the various marks. It is also difficult to get an accurate read on any luster that may be present. Since many coins are purchased online today this can be a good exercise.

COLLECTING TIP – If you are new to the collecting hobby and are unsure of how to get started then there are a few things that can be helpful. Subscribe to Coin World or Numismatic News and begin to read and familiarize yourself with the language, terms, and current hobby issues. Talk to the dealers and ask questions. If they are with a customer, be patient and polite and wait for a moment. They are usually most willing to share their knowledge and maybe gain a new customer. Attend talks and seminars.
