The answer is through the course of hosting PAN coin shows since the late 1970's; all sorts of problems or situations have come up over these many years. Occasionally a dispute between a buyer and seller occurs. Sometimes the dispute escalates to the point of requiring security to remove a person from the show floor. The person asked to leave objects on the basis of his membership in PAN. We have heard the argument that a said dealer or helper is not a PAN member and should be removed instead. It is our policy to have every dealer and helper as part of our membership. You, as a dealer, are now invested and partnered with what PAN does. You are part of the organization that is providing the venue and as such, are in a better position when we have to mediate a dispute. Granted it is rare but it has happened.
