

Dealers that are traveling, remember that we will have a secure dealer drop off at your table on the show floor on Wednesday evening October 23<sup>rd</sup> from 3:00 pm until 7:00 pm.

The DoubleTree by Hilton is beside the Monroeville Convention Center and is a short walk across the parking lot. You can leave your car in the hotel lot and not have to worry about parking. This will also help us to allow for more spots for the customers attending the coin show.

**PAN eGRADE** This 1878 S Trade Dollar was the subject coin in the last PANeNEWS issue. There were a few opinions on this one that ranged from AU 55 to MS 62. It is a raw ungraded coin. The obverse has a slight bit of rub at the thigh area along with the left arm. This could be due to stacking and not from circulated wear. Liberty's lower jaw has a small mark or ding that unfortunately is in a critical area. The field also has some small nicks or bag marks. It does have a proof like appearance when rotating the coin that cannot be ascertained in the photograph. Another photographic drawback is not being able to examine the reeding on the edge. This coin has a dark toned edge that would lead one to conclude that it may have been dipped a while back. The natural retoning is a nice pleasing gold and blue color. It would probably not make it through a grading service as original. The fields on both sides have some very fine but evident criss crossing lines that would lead one to believe that it had a light cleaning at one time. It could have been the victim of the old carpet rubbing routine to make it shiny and better. Many a young collector got this great advice from their non-numismatic fathers when they were kids.

The reverse eagle looks good without rub or wear and is nicely struck with good detail on the head, wing tips, and talons. The fields do not have any major marks or gouges. There is still a good amount of luster. Given all of this it would be safe to conclude that a grade of "details of an AU 58" would be appropriate. So how does one determine a value? Well, It is one of the higher mintages. An

AU 50 would be about \$250 to MS 62 at about \$1,200. How does \$450 sound?

get you started on a different numismatic path through time and history. The next eNEWS issue will reveal the answer to the posed question and an opinion on the grade of this coin along with the identity.



Jacob Shank conducted the kid's auction that featured items donated by PAN and the dealers attending the coin show. 


