John Burns' Book Inventory Sold – On Friday May 9th a book auction was conducted at the storage facility of numismatic book dealer John Burns who unexpectedly died this past January. There were in excess of 8,000 books and catalogues that made it necessary to sell very large lots of John's collection. Many collectors expressed an interest in purchasing individual volumes but the





size of his inventory made it more cost effective to offer the material to book wholesalers that came to Pittsburgh to bid. One of the interesting lots was a hardbound set of numismatists from the early 30's through the 1980's.

The collection of books filled two large 20' X 40' storage lockers and three smaller lockers that were $15' \times 20'$ each. It took a massive effort by a team of PAN members to sort, clean, box and stack the books to be viewed reasonably by interested parties.


night on this earth was with the friends he loved and enjoying an evening with great food and fine drink.

At left Brad Karleff recalls the last evening that he and friends dined with Big John at a Brazilian Steakhouse at the Fun Show in Orlando without any indication that he would pass away in his sleep that same evening. John's last



was not easily convinced. Armand took it upon himself to discreetly call the chef in advance and asked him to prepare a special dish with the emphasis on red meat for his special large friend. As the numismatic luminaries were seated the chef appeared and placed before John's eyes the largest meatball on a bed of spaghetti that the roomful had ever seen. The look on Burns' face and the roar of laughter was priceless.



Armand passed away in 1997. I am sure John Burns and Armand are now recalling that special night and the great memories and numismatic book tales that were the passion that they each shared.

The evening ended with a small auction of interesting items that John collected would want some of his friends to have.




The room began to fill quickly as a line began to form during registration. Each young person is given a packet that has free coins and ten PAN dollars that can be used for the kid's auction. The talk that was presented by host Sam Deep covered the grading of Barber coins with the focus on barber

dimes. Each participant was given one to grade and allowed to keep it for their collection. Sam showed them what to look for to determine the numerical grade and used a power point presentation to demonstrate how to use the popular Photograde guide. The program is quick paced with questions followed by a free coin for the right answer. There never seems to be a shortage of hands in the air.

The auction is always the highlight and held as the last part of the program. Fifty lots of a variety of numismatic items were offered. PAN purchases the lots or relies on donations from our dealers that are very generous and glad to be able to help a successful and vibrant program. The PANKidZone takes place on Saturday during the spring and fall coin shows. If your kids or grandkids have never been to one then please make the time to bring them. We have some high school age young people that have been coming since they were very young and still enjoy it.

In God We Trust medal is the latest PAN project that is continuing with great enthusiasm. PAN president Tom Uram developed the idea as a result of the National Motto 150th Anniversary. They are for sale on the PAN website <u>www.pancoins.org</u> with payment by credit card or can be purchased by check using the form at below. Part of the proceeds of the medal sale is donated to PAN.



The key players in having the motto placed on our coinage were U.S. Mint Director and later 13th Governor of PA, James Pollock, Salmon P. Chase Treasury Secretary under Abraham Lincoln and Reverend Mark R. Watkinson.

Each medal is housed in a folder that explains the idea of a National Motto and each man's role in the process of an Act of Congress to have In God We Trust placed on the two-cent piece of 1864.

The likeness of these famous men is beautifully done by the skill of U.S. Mint sculptor and engraver Don Everhart. These medals make a great gift along with an historic story.


