The John Burns Memorial Reference Library dedication ceremony at the American Numismatic Association World's Fair of money was a very well received event. A crowd of 30-40 notable numismatists, friends, and media were on hand for the this emotional and memorable ceremony. John's estate administrator, Pat McBride, organized the dedication. The emcee was Sam Deep one of



John's good friends. Sam and NBS E-Sylum editor Wayne Homren recalled stories of John's life.

Kerry Wetterstrom of CNG Inc. suggested to McBride that John would not be very pleased with this whole



traveling library idea with his namesake. Kerry remembered that John would frequently complain to him about the customers that would browse through his book inventory and would walk away without purchasing anything. He would mumble with the forceful resonance that was one of his noted trademarks, "This ain't no library. This stuff is for sale!"

There were some very nice book donations made by Denis Loring, Allan Schein, Jeff Starck, Paul Cunningham, Carl Waltz, and many others that came by during the show. A donation box was set up for contributions to help keep the wheels on the traveling library. There were cash donations alon

with pledges made by John Kraljevich, Ira Goldberg, and Bill Shamhart.

The outpouring of support was bolstered by quite a number of noted numismatists that came back to the Club Midway section to be a part of the occasion. ANA president Walter Ostromecki, Executive director Kim Kiick, and Convention Director Rhonda Scurek represented the American Numismatic Association. Other notable attendees included Cliff Mishler, George Kolbe, David Fanning, Kathy McFadden, David



Papal Visit, PAN Connection Pennsylvania Association of Numismatists President Thomas Uram had the idea that a quality medal should be produced to commemorate the U.S. visit of Pope Francis. For PAN, it was conceived as an artistic endeavor instead of a religious project. It was obvious that the highlight of the Papal visit would be Philadelphia and many souvenier type items would be created that would focus on this historic occasion. Nothing had been put forth to recognize the Washington D.C. visit that is the first destination of Pope Francis.

In January of 2015 Tom made an appointment to meet with officials of the Catholic Diocese of Washington. The concept of creating a Papal medal was well received and agreed that it would have to be a superb quality product or nothing at all. Tom's coin collecting background and



Tom contacted U.S. Mint sculptor and engraver Don Everhart about taking on a private commission. He knew very well of Don's gifted talents from his work at the U.S. Mint and a previous medal that Don had done for Tom highlighting the 150th anniversary of our National Motto, In God We Trust. Mr. Everhart agreed to take on this project and began preparing sketches. These were presented to the Diocese and the final selections were decided.

Don's artistic rendition on the medal's obverse succinctly captured the Pope's warm and friendly personality. The reverse design brilliantly features three of Washington's iconic domes. The center dome is the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, the dome to the left is the seat of the Diocese, the Cathedral of Saint Matthew the Apostle, and the dome to the right is the immediately recognizable U.S. Capitol Building. The detail and time involved under a tight schedule was challenging for Don Everhart but the end product is beautiful and compelling.

Northwest Territorial Mint, a private company, was contracted to produce the medals in silver and bronze. Their experience in producing quality work is known throughout numismatic circles. The finished product exceeded all expectations and delighted the first few people that saw the end result. They are now available for sale through the Pennsylvania Association of Numismatists website to the collector that appreciates the medallic beauty and to the religious that are fully engaged in this Pope's global popularity.

A number of the medals have been set aside as special gifts for visiting Cardinals, Guests, and Dignitaries that will be attending the scheduled Papal Mass at the Basilica of the National Shrine on September 23rd. The 1.75" medals are housed in a bi-fold sleeve that will describe this very special event. The large 3" size will come in a custom wood box.



PAN has contracted with the Arc of Washington County, which promotes community involvement, independence and dignity for children and adults with intellectual and developmental challenges to assemble the many medals into the containers and sleeves. This project is an opportunity to employ those that may have difficulty in the job place. The workers at ARC are very excited to be part of this historic project and the collaboration is a perfect match.

Simcha Kuritzky is an expert in the coinage of Israel. He has won the most ANA exhibit awards than anyone to date.



The T-shirt order was placed last month and all



As word of the Pope medal spread around and the imagery was finalized more demand for the small medal and holder increased dramatically when the Basilica of the National Shrine wanted a sizable inventory for their gift shop. Of course we thought that would be a wonderful idea. The problem became assembling the large number of medals into their custom bi-fold holders. Thousands of them needed to be ready for the Pope's September 23rd visit. It

would be a daunting task for our PAN Board members.

Tom remembered an agency in






