

# Centennial of The United States of America's Entrance Into World War I (A Medallic Tribute)

Finally after years of attempting to keep us out of the war in Europe President Woodrow Wilson on the 6th of April 1917 asked Congress to declare war on Germany. His patience having been exhausted in his dealings with the Imperial German Government and the American people having been stirred up by a series of incidents including the sinking of the Lusitania and the Zimmerman note, the time had come for America's entrance into the War to end all Wars.

#### **Declaration of War Medal**


The American Numismatic Society decided to commemorate America's entrance into the First World War with a medal. Eli Harvey (1860-1957) was commissioned and his *Declaration of War Medal*, 1917 was the result. It was bronze, 3-1/2 inches in diameter, produced by the Medallic Art Company, New York. It was to be a single sided piece with a large fierce looking Eagle with its wings spread, perched on a rock with the date APRIL 6, 1917 below. There were 113 issued in bronze and another 50 issued in silver.

French Premier Alexandre Ribot sent a mission to the United States soon after President Wilson asked Congress to declare war. The French Mission contained both political and military representatives of the Third Republic. Their reason for existence was to coordinate American participation in the Great

War. The member of the mission, who stood out the most to the leaders of the Wilson Administration, the Congress and the U.S. Army, as well as the American people, was Marshall Joseph Joffre. For many Americans, Joffre personified both France and her Army as the "Hero of the Marne." The British, not

to be out done by their French counterparts, also sent a similar contingent.

The British and French War Commissions Visit to New York City Medal, 1917 The British and French War Commissions Visit to New York City Medal, 1917, was another piece sponsored by the American Numismatic Society. This time they commissioned Daniel Chester French (1850-1931) to the task. French's obverse was a



very stylish allegorical head of Victory, much in the fashion that was popular on the European continent. It appears she is wearing a trench helmet to which a sprig of oak, a lily and a cluster of pine needles were added, as symbols of England, France and the United States, no doubt.

The medal was bronze and had a diameter of 2-1/2 inches. The legend surrounding the rim reads: "TO COMMEMORATE THE VISIT TO NEW YORK OF THE FRENCH AND BRITISH WAR COMMISSIONS 1917." The reverse design was created by French's former assistant, and ANS member, Evelyn B.

Longman. Her creation is modeled in a more streamlined, hard-edged style, but still features an allegorical configuration of three figures. Joan of Arc represents France; a medieval knight represents England and a flowing draped Lady Liberty, with sword in hand representing the United States coming to the aid of all Europe.



This excerpt is a nice taste into the type of material that is typically in the Clarion. It is our hope that it is enough to wet your appetite to join PAN and start receiving our publication.

# Historic RittenhouseTown to Honor John Mercanti 12<sup>th</sup> Chief Engraver/Sculptor of the United States Mint

Calling John Mercanti an "important but somewhat unsung artist," the Board of Directors of Historic Rittenhouse Town located in Fairmont Park, will be awarding the 2017 David Rittenhouse Award at its annual gala in May.

The David Rittenhouse Award honors those who demonstrate excellence as it represents one of the many contributions that Rittenhouse made to American history," said Barbara Rittenhouse, Board President. "David Rittenhouse was an amazing man. In his lifetime he was an astronomer, inventor, mathematician, surveyor and the successor to Benjamin Franklin as President of the American Philosophical Society. We reserve this prestigious award for those who've contributed their talents at the highest level to our nation."

John Mercanti produced more coins and medal designs than any other employee in the history of the U.S. Mint. Among his works, (in addition to the iconic American Silver Eagle) are gold and silver commemorative coins honoring the Olympic Games, the Statue of Liberty, Dwight Eisenhower, Louis Armstrong, Helen Hayes; five circulating State Quarters and numerous commemorative and bullion medals.

Born in Philadelphia, Mercanti received his artistic training at the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts, The Philadelphia College of Arts and the Fleisher Art Memorial School.

Previous recipients of the David Rittenhouse Award have included Derrick Pitts, Chief Astronomer and Planetarium Director of the Franklin Institute, Keith Thompson, Executive Officer of the American Philosophical Society and Owen Gingrich, professor emeritus of astronomy and the history of science at Harvard University and a senior astronomer emeritus at the Smithsonian Astrophysical Observatory.

The award, which will be part of the year long celebration of the 225<sup>th</sup> anniversary of David Rittenhouse being named the first Director of the U.S. Mint, will be presented to Mr. Mercanti on May 17<sup>th</sup>. 2017 at a reception and dinner at the Merion Cricket Club for his decades of service and outstanding work as the 12<sup>th</sup> Chief Engraver/Sculptor of the United States Mint.

The *buy it now* feature is offered for the first time with this auction and is turning out to be another PAN good idea. There is a trend starting with the efforts of CoinZip.com and Alan Stullenbarger to create these online auctions as fundraisers for coin clubs. 
great potential as we navigate coins shows and the digital world that is now becoming part of our daily lives.

The American Numismatic Association will hold an election for board of governors this June. PAN is supporting our current PAN president Thomas Uram and PAN Life member Col. Steve Ellsworth ret. In case you are not familiar with the ANA below is an excerpt off of the association's www.money.org website

The American Numismatic Association is a nonprofit, educational organization and is recognized under the Internal Revenue Service Code as a 501(c) (3) tax-exempt organization. It is governed by a nine-member Board, which includes a president, vice president, and seven governors at large. The ANA's federal charter, granted in perpetuity by the United States Congress, rests control of the Association in the hands of this Board.

In 2017 the terms of all nine officers will expire. Those elected will be installed at the

*ANA's* 126th Anniversary Convention in Denver, CO, August 4, 2017 and will compose the Board of Governors for the next two years.

Individual members 13 years of age or older as of March 31 of an election

year and who have been members of the Association for at least one year as of that date shall be entitled to vote in any Association election. ANAmember clubs are entitled to one vote.

Both Tom and Steve are dedicated to the hobby and will work to keep the collector in the forefront within the ANA. The photo at left is Tom presenting Steve our PAN Dealer of the year award in 2015.


