PAN 1985 Lincoln Way Suite 23 #225 White Oak PA 15131 PAN and eNEWS editor, Patrick McBride (Benjamin Franklin re-enactor) have created a GoFundMe page to raise money to bring renowned Abraham Lincoln actor, Dennis Boggs, to the *American Numismatic Association's World's Fair of Money* to be held at the Stephens Convention Center, in Rosemont (Chicago), IL on August 10 – 14, 2021. The money generated will cover Dennis' fee, airfare, hotel stay, etc.

This fund drive was originally created for the 2020 Pittsburgh ANA-WFM that was canceled due to Covid-19. The money raised was rolled over to this new "Get Abe to Rosemont" fund drive. Between GoFundMe and private donations, we have raised close to \$2,000 so far. Our goal this time is to raise more than \$4,000 so that we can also help old Ben Franklin to get to Rosemont.

Lincoln and Franklin have appeared together previously charming the young and old alike with their wit, humor and historical tales. They have together attended the Florida United Numismatists (FUN) convention in January of 2020 and the



The 2021 Morgan and Peace dollars are moving closer to a reality! The United States Mint has placed the Morgan Dollar on their website product schedule for release on May 24th. The Peace dollar will be released on June 7th. These coins have been through quite the journey.

They began in 2019 as a commemorative coin idea for the year 2021 by Citizens Coinage Advisory Committee member Mike Moran and CCAC Chairman at the time and our PAN President Tom Uram. The concept was to have the remakes of these classic coins become one of the two commemorative issues allowed per year by law. If it was successfully able to move through the



legislative process, then the surcharge money would be used for numismatic education that would be managed by the American Numismatic Association. It was hoped that some of the raised funds would be able to help state numismatic associations fund part of their journal printing costs. This would be the first time in the history of the commemorative coinage program that money raised from sales would benefit the coin collecting hobby. Most commemorative coin sales are generated by coin collectors. How appropriate and exciting that a portion of coin collectors' money would go back into the hobby that they love.

The Morgan and Peace coins have received a lot of attention and enthusiasm from the coin collecting community. Mike and Tom immediately realized that this would be a winner. The financial benefit to numismatic organizations would have been broad and not channeled to any specific non-profit, museum, memorial, sports event, etc. Finally, we have a commem that most collectors like and are excited about and will financially benefit the hobby.

But alas, it was not to be as the legislative process for successfully creating commemorative coinage became quite challenging. Issued coinage must become the law of the land with both houses of congress and a presidential signature. What is a critical ingredient is strong sponsorship with a super majority of co-sponsors in the House and Senate. The two current commemorative coins that won the legislative race with stronger political support are the Christa McAuliffe, teacher in space and the National Law Enforcement Memorial and Museum coins. These commemorative coins were very popular with legislators. One hundred-year-old silver dollars did not generate much support from the halls of Congress. At this point it appeared that Tom Uram and Mike Moran's dream would not come true since the critical date of 2021 would likely pass without the Morgan and Peace dollar anniversary recognition coins being minted.



After a period of brief mourning, Tom and Mike went back to the drawing board and realized the coins could still be produced as non-commemoratives / legal tender coins. They would not need the two thirds support in congress and would only would require a simple majority vote. The United States Mint officials and Director, David Ryder confirmed their idea was indeed a legal pathway forward.

The new legislative bill was carefully rewritten with House Rep Andy Barr's sponsorship once again. Obtaining the co-sponsors would be an easier task this time. The bill passed the House of Representatives.

2021 Morgan and Peace dollars continued.

It then went on to pass the Senate. It was signed by President Trump just before his term ended. This difficult endeavor was a numismatic victory that made it just under the wire! The downside is that the stakeholder (in this case numismatics) would not receive any surcharge funding. In the end these beautiful reissues will be produced. Non-profit numismatic organizations will miss out on much needed support funding but will assuredly and creatively scrape up support dollars by other means as they have done in the past. In conclusion, it came to be somewhat of a half victory but the collectors will reap the better half of the bargain in what will be some very beautiful coins. non-profit in 1986. This was done to enable us to benefit from tax exemption as many other numismatic organizations have done for many years. But... if you notice we are a (c)(4) rather than a (c)(3). Why is that? At the time, PAN was involved in repealing the Pennsylvania sales tax on rare coins and bullion. A 501(c)(4) is able to raise funds for

political action which we have done on occasion to hire lobbyists to keep the sales tax exemption in place.


PAN has been at the forefront of the tax issue to this day. Our efforts and a great working relationship with the Industry Council for Tangible Assets has kept us a tax-free state for more than thirty years.

The problem we faced under this designation is the ineligibility to participate in fundraising days of giving, grants, matching funds etc. Last year we finally did something about it and created a separate PAN Foundation. We now have more flexibility to raise money.

PAN has been moving forward in this effort and has created a *Legacy Giving* page on our website. https://pancoins.org/legacy-giving/

To start out, I would mostly pose for photographs which was a lot of fun. I might be asked an occasional question that I would stumble through as a seasoned politician would do. As time went on, I learned an amazing amount about Franklin's life and very importantly, his personality. Today I am quite comfortable in portraying such an enigmatic historic figure. I discovered that learning to be a re-enactor is very similar to becoming interested in a particular coin series and eventually becoming so very immersed in it that one finds oneself to be a somewhat of an expert.

This living journey through history continues today. I along with my alter ego would be delighted if you would set aside some time away from the coin show to have a seat, rest your feet, and hear me practice some of my expertise.
