


Dealer Corner - This show is a sellout. The coin market is hot right now. Please notify Ed Hammond 607-368-2617 or Blaine Shiff 412-531-4100 with any questions or concerns.

The bourse floor plan is posted to our website. Take a look to see where you will be located. Most everyone is in their usual spots. We will always try to move dealers to a better location if we can. The sooner we know who is attending then the better we are able to design the final floor plan.

Dealer set up day starts on Wednesday, May 18 at 3:00pm (not before).

No dealers will be allowed onto the show floor before that time unless special arrangements are made. You are welcome to come into the loading dock man door to register and get your badges before 3:00pm and wait in the dock area. We make personal badges for the PAN show. Email us with any updates. All early dealers will need to pay the \$50 one-time early bird fee even if they are "on your table" and will not be permitted onto the floor until 4:00 pm Wednesday. Table helpers are a different category and stay at the dealer table for a majority of the show. PAN is trying to be fair to the many early birds that pay the fee and abide by our guidelines.



After you are registered, you will have an option of **three entry points** to the show floor depending on you table location. They are: **1)** the loading dock **2)** the front entrance **3)** the front parking lot corner double man doors. These three access points will make entry faster and more efficient for everyone. Please unload your vehicles and promptly park them to allow others to have access to these entry points, especially the loading dock.

Dealer set-up continues again on Thursday May 19th from 8:00am until 12noon sharp. The public enters at noon. PAN members are allowed to enter the show floor an hour earlier at 11:00am.

Early Bird Dealers will be permitted onto the show floor starting on Wednesday at **4:00pm, but not before**. We must give the booth holders a chance to get in and set up. We will be enforcing this rule so please make your travel plans accordingly. We will make you a personalized badge if you pre-register. Go to our website Dealer tab.

Inaugural Debut - Civil War Money & Memorabilia Showcase

At the Spring PAN Coin Show -- May 19-21, 2022

The Inaugural **Civil War Money & Memorabilia Showcase** event will be held at the PAN Coin Show in Monroeville, PA from May 19th through 21st. The CW Showcase will feature exhibits, displays and talks -- each featuring collectible items from the era – including coins, paper currency, scrip, tokens, and more.

A special theme will involve the unexpected connection between the tragic sinking of the doomed **SS Central America** and the life of **General William T. Sherman** before the Civil War broke out. “In the mid-1850s, Sherman was in San Francisco – a rising star in banking during the Gold Rush era,” said Rick Lank, author and organizer. “His banking concern, Lucas & Co., dealt with the prominent assayers who provided banks and the federal government with gold ingots.” Gold was shipped east via Panama on paddle-wheelers such as the **SS Central America**.



Among the speakers being lined up for the Showcase, a featured guest will be **Bob Evans** – who has been the chief researcher and curator for the SS Central America and its enormous “**Garden of Gold**” that was found 8,000 feet under the Atlantic in the late 1980s – the treasure included over 2 tons of gold ingots and San Francisco minted gold coins that were lost at sea in 1857. This loss – estimated at \$50 million in today’s dollars -- had a tremendous impact on the nation’s economy, as it was intended to be a special reserve to stabilize an already rocky banking community.



That maritime disaster set off the “Panic of ‘57” and indirectly caused the collapse of several banks – causing “Uncle Billy the Banker” to lose his second banking job and sank his career in finance. Subsequent events then catapulted Sherman to New Orleans, just in time for Louisiana to secede and jettison “Uncle Billy” Sherman into the War... and the history books. **General T. Sherman reenactor Kris Gunvalsen** will be appearing on Saturday May 21st at 1:00pm.

According to Rebecca Rush (pictured on right, discussing the Treasury Girls with Abe), one of the organizers, there will be talks that pertain to the role that President Abe Lincoln had in financing the Civil War, including introducing women employees into the US Treasury Department in a big way (known as the “Treasury Girls”) and authorizing three new mints at the height of the War. And we will “follow the money” as the Confederate Treasure Train trundled from Richmond, Virginia to Georgia in April and May of 1865– dispensing gold, silver, CSA paper money, and bonds along its route. (General Joe Johnston, who surrendered to General Sherman, in North Carolina, converted many silver pesos into CSA mementos as part of his last payroll.)



An invitation to participate in the Showcase has been extended to the National Civil War Museum in Harrisburg, PA. The organizers are a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization called “No Small Change.” Contributions to the educational mission of the non-profit are welcome. Sponsors for the CW Showcase event are also being sought and sponsors will be recognized on promotional materials.

More details about the activities and participants will be forthcoming.

Among all things Jim was a serious Numismatic enthusiast. He will also be missed by his dog, Sunny and many friends. Jim was laid to rest at Restland Memorial Park, Monroeville, PA. 




