Kenny Sammut is running for one of nine positions as Governor of the ANA. He was named ANA's Young Numismatist of the Year in 2019. He has been a proud member of the Harrisburg Coin Club for several years and is a huge help to the Club's annual coin show, which will be held this year September 15th and 16th at the Scottish Rite Entertainment Complex in Harrisburg.

Tom Uram from Pittsburgh, is running unopposed for President of the ANA, following a career as a collector, scholar, numismatic adviser to several US Secretaries of the Treasury, and current President of the Pennsylvania Association of Numismatists.

Pat McBride, also from Pittsburgh, is running for Governor, having served for many years as Secretary of the PAN, editor of the PAN e newsletter and an outstanding re-enactor of Benjamin Franklin, sharing the famous man's wit and wisdom with audiences of all ages.

The Harrisburg Coin Club proudly endorses all three candidates and encourages all ANA members to be active voters when ballots are sent out on June 1. June 30 is the deadline for all ballots to be returned.
